

The Washington Wizards Return to China in Honor of 30 Years of U.S.-China Relations

The Wizards were the first NBA team to visit China after the normalization of diplomatic relations in 1979 (at that time known as the Washington "Bullets"). A star player from each of the three decades since the team's historic visit to China participated in a goodwill tour in Shanghai and shot a few baskets with Shanghai World Expo 2010 mascot "Haibao" at the USA Pavilion construction site on September 7, 2009.

Media Summary

The visiting Washington Wizards delegation created a buzz in China during their first stop in Shanghai, September 6-8. The Public Affairs Section arranged media events dominated all relevant media coverage; stories run by Chinese media at both the national and the regional levels were very positive and noted that the theme for the Wizards' return trip to China to observe the 30th anniversary of bilateral diplomatic relations. The Wizards' presence at the USA National Pavilion construction site and their interacting with the 2010 Expo Mascot became a focus for the most stories generated so far and the picture showing the players shooting baskets with the mascot of the 2010 Expo appeared in almost all coverage.

In addition, new media's enthusiasm in covering the Washington Wizards' trip to Shanghai was also very high. While the above coverage has been widely reposted at most of China's portal sites, QQ.com launched special coverage with a focus on the Chinese host organizations. PAS Shanghai cooperated with eastday.com (the most influential portal site in East China) to host a live online web chat and web cast for the Wizards on 09/07. According to the statistics provided by Eastday.com, the total number of online netizens during the chat (15:15 – 16:00) was 7,509 with 127 questions and there were 232,461 page views during the first 24 hours. There have also been approximately 750 reposts of articles on this webchat so far, with about six minutes broadcast on TV.
